Series Overview

Paul followed a similar pattern in his letters. First he would rehearse gospel doctrine, then he would offer, as an outflow of the gospel at work in us, practical application of what it looks like in family and community. Ephesians follows the same pattern. First he presents the cause of our salvation—Jesus. Then he shows the effect of our salvation—love and good works, which Paul calls "walking in love."

Several things are repeated and crystal clear throughout the book. First, that Christ is preeminent and His sacrifice sufficient. Second, that Christ in us is sufficient. The phrase Paul uses the phrase "in Christ" or some variation of it 15x by the end of Ephesians 1. It was the hallmark phrase of his teaching. The phrase is used 75x in the New Testament and 73 of them are Paul.

The aim of this series is to show the beauty of Christ and His sacrifice, who we are "in Him," and to discuss what living by faith "in Him" looks like in the church and the home.

Ephesians: The Guide Book to New Life in God's Family

This book opens a window into the new reality we have as "saints" in God's household. Paul prays that we'd see it in Ephesians 1:17-18 when he prays "that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints."

So first, Paul teaches us to think like God's family. Second, he teaches us how to live it out.

Occasion, Purpose, and Message

OCCASION

What prompted the writing of this book?

Occasion and purpose: Paul founded the church in Ephesians, though he now writes this letter from a prison cell. Many of Paul's letters were responses to false teaching or problems that developed in certain churches, but Ephesians is a sermon. It's all gospel and deals with topics at the very core of what it means to be a Christian—both in faith and in practice. This book is a spiritual father writing to his spiritual children to make sure the church family has the blueprint to stay healthy now and in future generations.

Message

Localized Message for Clarksville, TN

Clarksville believes:

- Lies: "My identity is in my work. I'm defined by what I do. Things outside of God are ultimate."
- Hedonism: "I'll be fulfilled if I pursue pleasure."
- **Legalism**: "I'm saved by my morality, my achievements, or other externals like family pedigree, military career, or my ethnicity."
- False gods: "Things outside of God are ultimate—work, family, success, sports, reputation."

God gives:

- Truth: "Charles Spurgeon said, 'Sin always ruins where it reigns.' Sin destroys us, but Jesus rescues us."
- Identity: "My identity is not in my work, but Christ's work. My identity is not centered on who I am, but whose I am. I'm now a child of God through Christ."
- Salvation: "We were spiritually dead and separated from God but He saved us."
- Spiritual power: "The Holy Spirit helps me, fills me, and enables me to comprehend the gospel, grow in God, and serve others with supernatural results."
- Mission: "Once I am saved, I am given a new way of living and a new mission—to glorify God through my life and in the nations of the world."
- Family: "I belong. I'm united with Christ and am loved perfectly by the Father."
